
#### **COLLATION OF JUNE MONTH ACTIVITIES - 2021**

#### 1. Event: Innovative home decorative ideas using warli art


#### WARLI ART & HOME DÉCOR

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#### 2. Event: Creative and Innovative still life photography


#### A CHANCE TO DUST OFF YOUR PHOTOGRAPHY SKILLS



A set of criteria were followed to filter the submissions, some of them were, originality of the images, presence of e-fix data in the image, no manipulation of the images and decent image with good resolution.









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








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




4. Are you Industry Ready and Innovative in your Ideas?















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#### 5. IEEE prize distribution and membership drive

With an aim of educating the crowd about the importance of IEEE membership and appreciating those who actively participated in IEEE events, the event was graced by Dr.Parameshachari B D, Prof & Head, GSSSIETW, Mysore. During the event presided by Shri. D. K. Mohan, the chairman at CIT, awareness was spread among the undergraduate and graduate students interested in IEEE designated fields about the educational, technical and professional development opportunities. The purpose of the event was to promote technological innovation and excellence among the students for the betterment of humanity.

#### 6. A webinar: Ethical hacking and cyber security

The *department of ECE* organized a webinar on *Ethical Hacking and Cyber Security* on 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> June 2021. Mr. Samarth Bhaskar Bhatt, the Technical Director of Reverse Engineering Infosec, Bangalore, was the chief speaker of the event. The events initiated at 9am on both the days were attended by 50 students from 6<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> semesters of ECE.

The goal of the event was to make the students learn and perform hacking in a professional manner. As a professional hacker, an individual is expected to present a maturity scorecard highlighting the client's overall risk, vulnerabilities and suggestions towards improvement.

Through the webinar, the students understood the need to update hack-preventing tactics and install several technologies to protect the system from becoming a victim to the hacker. Various



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aspects related to cyber security which is relevant in the current industrial scenario were introduced to the students.

The speaker focused on the methods to prevent data from being stolen and misused by malicious attackers. He underlined the significance of discovering vulnerabilities from an attacker's point of view and then fixing the weak points. Implementing a secure network that prevents security breaches and protecting networks through real-world assessments were some other key points highlighted in the event.









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## 7. Event: Practical Approach towards Mini-Project Development using System on Chip Platform

A 5 day workshop was organized by the *department of ECE*, *Practical Approach towards Mini-Project Development using System on Chip Platform* on 10<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> June 2021. The virtual workshop that began at 2pm on 5 consecutive days hosted three honorary speakers, namely, Pooja P M, Entrepreneur-In-Residence at NIDHI-EIR program, DST Govt. of India, Dr. S. L. Pinjare, Professor, Dept. of ECE, NITTE, Bangalore and our own faculty member, Dr. Cyril Prasanna Raj P. Professor, Dept. of ECE.

The event primarily focused on making the 6<sup>th</sup> semester students of ECE understand the real time software development environment. All the 120 students present in the virtual workshop were expected to gain a thorough understanding of the problem they chose and the language/software being utilized to solve the same.

Mini Projects are similar to the first run scored by a batsman to complete his century. They help the students to explore and strengthen the understanding of fundamentals through practical



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



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
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application of theoretical concepts. It acts like a beginner's guide to do larger projects later in their career.

This workshop helped the students to boost their skills and widen their horizon of thinking. All the participants attained guidance on choosing a topic. The speakers covered the concepts of MEMS and mathematical modeling. In addition to that, the students learned to apply the appropriate technology for Designing of FPGA as well.


The management students of CIT actively participated in the virtual session conducted on Zoom, an online meeting application.

As the event came to an end, Prof. Basavraj Girimallanavar shared his opinion and thanked the resource persons for such an informative session.







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


## 9. Standardising the specifications of a Biogas run dual fuel Diesel engine for stationary applications

At present the engines used in automobiles will mostly be either petrol or diesel. In such engines only one particular type of fuel can be used. We're aware that the cost of fossil fuels like petrol and diesel is increasing day by day and in addition to that, the combustion of these fuels release carbon monoxide and carbon dioxide causing environmental pollution.

To educate students about the development of an alternative fuel, the *Department of Basic Sciences* organised a webinar on the topic, *Standardizing the specifications of a Biogas run dual fuel Diesel engine for stationary applications* on 12th June 2021. The chief speaker at the event was Dr. Bhaskar Jyoti Bohra, from the Energy Institute center of Rajiv Gandhi Institute of Petroleum Technology, Bengaluru.

Bio gas was developed when the requirement of alternative fuel was at its rise. Due to its low calorific value, bio gas won't contribute to environmental pollution. While Bio gas alone cannot be used as a fuel in automobiles, it's combined with diesel for usage. Since ordinary diesel engines do not function in this manner, a new type of diesel engine was developed to meet the purpose. The engine design, the ratio of mixing the two fuels, and its effect on





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calorific values were discussed. Finally the conclusion was derived that it was beneficial. They are utilized in many places for running buses and other automobiles.




#### 10. International Day of Yoga



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
The webinar was presented by Dr. Varsha, Assistant Professor of the MBA department, Cambridge Institute of Technology. The motive of conducting a webinar on such a topic was to inculcate professional ethics among the budding professionals and entrepreneurs.

Dr. Varsha explained to students using various instances the consequences of indulging in Plagiarism, a punishable offence. The act of plagiarism is viewed very seriously under various acts in UGC and AICTE and can attract punishment. If a student is found guilty of plagiarism, he or she might lose registration and if a faculty indulges in this act, he or she may lose the job.

The Government of India has initiated many rules to curb this unethical practice. Hence it is important to work on our own creativity, rather than copying ideas or content from others. The speaker also informed not to forget to mention citations in the research papers or books as applicable.

The webinar was useful to the young professionals so as to gradually incline towards ethical practices, develop and flourish by their own ideas and creativity. The webinar witnessed a participation of 245+ students and faculty members.








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
